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PREFACE

The publication "Women and Men in Serbia" is the result of the increasing need of users to monitor the state in society also through statistical data shown by sex.

The Government of the Republic of Serbia formed the Council for the Gender Equality Rights between Sexes, with the aim to create conditions for equal gender opportunities, as well as the Working Group for monitoring the realization of Millennium Development Goals and plans defined by the Millennium Declaration of the United Nations. All eight of these goals are related to gender equality, while two of them deal directly with gender equality. Regular, systematic monitoring of corresponding statistical indicators and their promotion is needed for the analysis of the state of affairs and the adoption of adequate policy measures and monitoring their realization. This publication, therefore, represents the beginning of building a sustainable institutional programme of gender statistics.

This publication of the Statistical Office of the Republic of Serbia offers a wider choice of demographic and other data, shown by sex, from the following fields:

- General Indicators
- Population
- Health
- Education
- Social Welfare
- Crime
- Employment and Earnings
- Decision Making.

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1. General Indicators

- Data on the total area of the Republic of Serbia include figures on the areas of Central Serbia and Vojvodina, without data on Kosovo and Metohija. All data in this publication refer to the above-mentioned territory.
- □ The **number of settlements** of the Republic of Serbia refers to the number of **settlements** of Central Serbia and Vojvodina.
- Data on the number of inhabitants were collected in censuses carried out from 1948 to 2002. In all seven censuses after World War II, every inhabitant with permanent residence had to be registered even if he/she was absent at the time of the census due to different reasons (travel, schooling, work abroad, military service, etc.) There is no complete comparison between the permanent and the entire population in the censuses. In censuses 1971-1991, besides the population in the country, the citizens who worked or lived abroad were also included in the permanent population. The citizens who worked or lived abroad shorter than a year were included in the 2002 Census, as well as citizens who lived or worked in our country for a year or longer.
- □ The **mean age of population** represents the median age at the moment of carrying out a census. It is calculated as a weighted arithmetic mean. The ageing process begins when the average age surpasses 30 years of age.
- □ The **life expectancy of women and men** shows the average age a liveborn baby will live to.
- □ The **ageing index** shows the ratio between the number of people aged 60 or over and the number of inhabitants below the age of 19. When the ageing index surpasses the value of 0.4, the population has already entered the process of ageing.
- □ The **total age dependency ratio** shows to which degree the working population is burdened by the contingent of children under 15 and old inhabitants over 65. The value under 100 shows the economic burden index of the working-age population contingent.
- □ The **population by sex and age** represents the number of persons of a particular sex, grouped according to age. The **table** shows the age-sex structure over absolute frequencies and/or over the percentage distribution. The **age pyramid** is a graphic presentation of the age-sex structure.
- Population projections represent the number of inhabitants projected for a particular year. The published data represent a middle-low variant. This variant represents a combination of hypotheses about middle-low fertility rates, changeable mortality rates and changeable migrations in the projected period.







Population by sex and age, 1991





2. Population

- □ A **liveborn baby** is considered the one who, at birth, showed the signs of life (breathing, normal heart function).
- Data on national or ethnic affiliation are obtained on the basis of free declaration by population or parents (guardians) in the case when children are under the age of 15.
- □ Data on **marital status** are shown for the population aged 15 and over, and refer to the legal status of entities (legal marital status), and not to the factual state within family units.
- **Native population** represents people who have lived in the same place since birth.
- □ Immigrant population represents the contingent of persons who moved from their place of birth or a previous residence to their present residence.
- A household is every family community or any other community of persons who live and spend their income together in order to satisfy basic necessities (accommodation, food, etc.)






Population aged 15 and over by marital status, sex and age, 2002 (percentage distribution)



3. Health

- □ The statistics of born childreinclude all children born in the observed year (both liveborn and stillborn children). A liveborn baby is the one who, at birth, showed the signs of life (breathing, normal heart function). A stillborn baby is the one who showed no signs of life, under the condition the baby was carried longer than 28 weeks.
- □ The statistics of deaths (mortalityi) clude every case of death. Coding and aggregation of data on the basic death unit is done according to the International Classification of Illnesses, X Revision (MKB-10).
- **Deaths by main causes of deaths**epresent the number of dead persons whose cause of death is the most frequent one.
- □ The total fertility rateepresents the average number of liveborn children borne by one woman.
- □ The **specific fertility rates** r women aged between 15 and 19 represent the number of children whose mothers are of the mentioned age, per 1000 of women aged 15-19 in the entire population.
- □ The **infant mortality**epresents the number of dead children aged 1 and under (since birth to the 11th month), in a particular calendar year.
- □ The **maternal mortality rate**represents the number of women who died during pregnancy, at delivery and in the first 40 days after delivery, owing to causes connected with these conditions, during the calendar year, per 100000 liveborn children.





4. Education

- □ The term **school** refers to an educational institution or unit which deals with educational work by following the curriculum.
- □ The **pupils of the first class of primary schools** are children aged 7 who enrolled in the first class of the primary school, with a smaller number of children who enroll aged 6.
- Pupils of the first class of secondary schools are children aged 15 who enroll in grammar schools, secondary vocational training schools or art schools that last 3 or 4 years.
- Pupils of three-year schools receive the third degree of educational attainment, while those in four-year schools receive the fourth degree of educational attainment.
- □ A **student acquires his/her status** by enrolling in an institution of higher learning. Persons who finished a corresponding secondary school have right to enroll in the first year of studies.
- **Teachers of primary and secondary schools** represent the educational staff who take part in the preparation, organization and holding of lessons, following the curriculum.
- □ **Teachers of high and higher schools** are: regular professors, associate professors, docents, lecturers, lecturers at secondary and post-secondary schools, professors at post-secondary schools, working full-time or part-time.
- A graduated student is the person who receives a degree after finished post-secondary school, university or an arts academy.
- □ A **Master of Sciences** is the person who defended his/her masters thesis which was the result of his/her independent work. The student thus classified and extended the existing scientific knowledge.
- A **Doctor of Sciences** is the person who earned a masters degree, and after defending the doctorate dissertation, he/she earned a PhD degree.
- □ The **highest school was completed** regardless of whether education was attained through completing a regular school or school which replaces the regular one. Data are presented only for population aged 15 and over, i.e. pre-school and primary school children are excluded.



Percentage distribution of population aged 15 and over by sex and educational attainment, 2002





Percentage distribution of population aged 15 and over without education by sex and age, 2002





5. Social Welfare

- □ Children in pre-school institutions who receive daily tutorage are looked after, nurtured and educated until they are 7, the age when they start school.
- □ Students in student hostels of primary and secondary schools are educated out of the place of residence of their parents who financially support them. They are provided with accommodation, food and education.
- □ **Hostels** provide accommodation and food for students of post-secondary schools, universities and arts academies during the studies.
- □ **Social welfare beneficiary** is every person who used certain forms and measures of social welfare and social welfare services during the reporting year.

7. Employment and Earnings

- □ Active population is made up of employed persons aged 15, as well as unemployed persons who are looking for a job, and persons who temporarily stopped working in order to do military service (unemployed active persons who do not work).
- Active employed population is made up of persons aged 15 and over who do specific types of jobs with a view to acquiring basic means of substinence.
- □ The term **activity** refers to the economic activity of an enterprise, shop, institution, cooperative, etc. a person works for.




Active employed population by sex and economic activity, 2002








Percentage distribution of employees in enterprises, institutions and organizations, by sex and educational background, 2003
