Number of passengers cars registered in 2010 in the Republic of Serbia decreased by 4.3% in comparison with the previous year, while number of lorries (trucks) increased by 9.8%. Dynamic growth was noted in the category of motorcycles 10.8%. However, all these estimations are to be considered with particular attention since methodology referring to motor vehicles has been changed by the Ministry of the Interior, meaning that, in majority of cases, data are not comparable with the previous year.

The greatest number of registered passengers' cars was produced by Zastava (domestic trademark). Regarding foreign trademarks, the following manufacturers were the most notable: Volkswagen, Opel, Ford, Fiat, Renault, Mercedes, Peugeot and Skoda.

Number of first time registered passengers' cars in 2010 in the Republic of Serbia increased by 14.9%, relative to the previous year and number of buses by 31.9%. Due to methodology changes, other data are not comparable with the previous year.

Total number of injury road accidents in 2010 decreased by 10.3% when compared to 2009. The greatest number of accidents was noted within built-up areas and amounted to 86.5% of total number of accidents.

Number of casualties in 2010 compared to 2009, decreased by 10.5%, while number of killed persons decreased by 18.8%.
