#### Methodological explanations

Since January 1st 2010 and in accordance with UN Statistical Commission recommendations, **general trade system** has been introduced, presenting broader exports and imports concept and involving overall goods that enter or exit the economic territory of the country, except the transit goods. Besides transit, excluded are also the temporary commodity transactions (fairs, test samples, etc.).

According to general trade system, goods are imported, i.e. exported into:

- free circulating area, rooms for internal processing or industrial free zones;
- customs storage places.

General trade system provides better adjustment to measures and criteria of the System of National Accounts and Balance of Payment.

From January 1st 2010, new version of Standard International Trade Classification - **SITC Rev 4** has been used.

Starting from 1999 the Statistical Office of the Republic of Serbia has not at disposal and may not provide available certain data relative to AP Kosovo and Metohia and therefore these data are not included in the coverage for the Republic of Serbia (total).
