

## 2011 Census of Population, Households and Dwellings in the Republic of Serbia

### Book 11: Daily migrants

In the book “Daily migrants” the Statistical Office of the Republic of Serbia publishes the final results of the 2011 Census of Population, Households and Dwellings<sup>1)</sup> on the daily migrations of economically active persons who perform an occupation, pupils and students, to the level of municipalities/cities.

The 2011 Census was carried out during the period from 1st to 15th October, 2011, in compliance with the Law on the Census of Population, Households and Dwellings (“The Official Gazette of the RS,” no. 104/09 and 24/11). The 2011 Census is financially supported by the European Union which has participated in the total costs with 60%.

#### Daily migrants

According to the 2011 Census methodology, daily migrants are those persons who work or go to school/university outside of the place of their usual residence, but who return on a daily basis or several times a week.

<sup>1)</sup> Census 2011 was not conducted on the territory of AP Kosovo and Metohija, while in the municipalities of Presevo and Bujanovac, recorded was the decreased coverage of the census units, due to boycott by the majority of Albanian population.

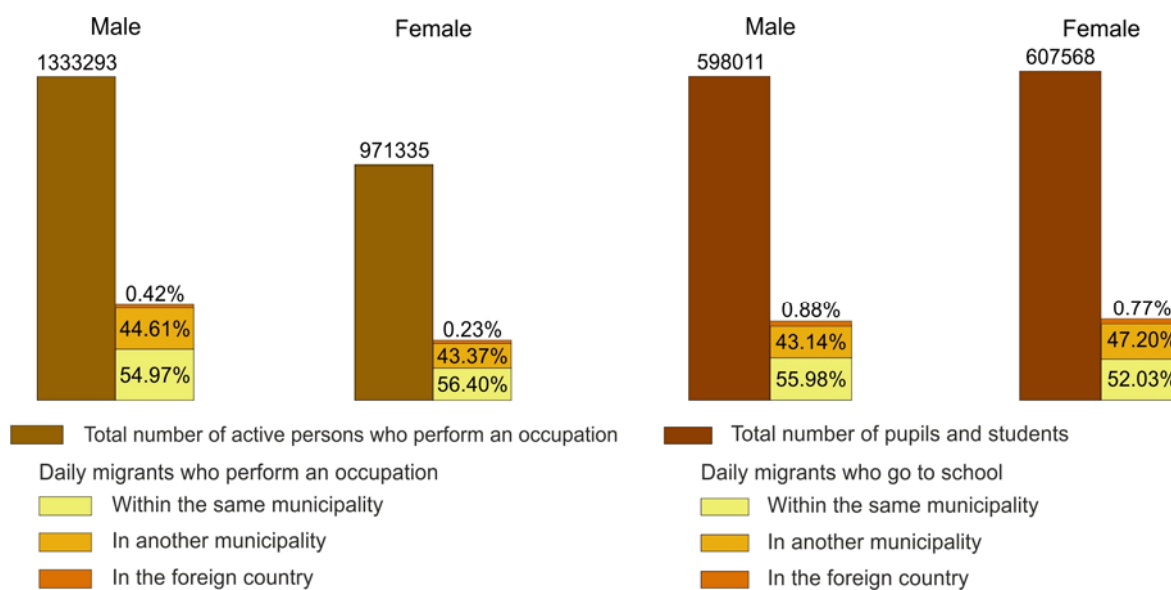

Observed by the regions, the highest share of daily migrants was recorded in the Šumadija and West Serbia region (31,38%) and the lowest in Belgrade region (19,40).

**Graph 2: Share of daily migrants who go to school/university in the total number of pupils and students, by sex, Republic of Serbia, 2011 Census**



Observed by sex, among daily migrants who perform an occupation, it is higher share of men (28,6%), than women (24,1%). On the other hand, among daily migrants who go to school/university, it is higher share of women (24,0%), than men (23,4%).
