IEP 1 – adjusted programme which defines the support to be given as to the adaptation of premises and conditions where learning takes place, also adjustment of working methods, books and learning tools, activities and their timetable, as well as the support persons.

IEP 2 – modified programme which defines the harmonisation of the general outcomes of education, adaptation of special standards of students' performances to regulated ones, and the adaptation of content for one subject matter, two or several ones or all of them.

Evaluation commission – Commission for the evaluation of needs for complementary educational, health and social support to a child or pupil/student.
