The Statistical Office of the Republic of Serbia (SORS) has announced the results of the Labour Force Survey for 2023 in this publication.

The Survey has been implemented as a continuous research in the Republic of Serbia since 2015, and the SORS has adopted a new, redesigned methodology of the Survey in 2021, in accordance with the new Regulation of the European Parliament and the Council. International recommendations and definitions were used in defining the basic labour force contingents; therefore, the information obtained from this survey is the most important source of data in the field of labour statistics, and its contents and methodology can be compared to similar data from other countries.

Since 2023, results have been based on the current demographic assessments based on the 2022 Population, Household and Dwelling Census.

Data in this survey are intended for a wide range of users in the country, and they are provided to numerous international organizations, at their request.

The Bulletin consists of several parts. Part 1 contains the basic labour market indicators trend at interannual level (year of 2022/2023). Part 2 provides the basic indicators of the population aged 15+ (rates and absolute values). Part 3 presents the basic indicators of employed population aged 15-89. Part 4 contains basic indicators of unemployed population (aged 15-74), and indicators related to population outside the labour force and potentially active population can be found in Part 5. Methodology explanations and the sample design are given at the end of the Bulletin.

ANNUAL ANALYSIS OF LABOUR FORCE SURVEY RESULTS, 2023

From the first quarter of 2023, results (LFS data) are calculated based on demographic estimates for 2022, which are based on the 2022 Census. Due to the improvement of the quality of demographic estimates in terms of improving the timeliness of data, the results for the reference quarter are calculated on the basis of demographic estimates for the current year, or the reference quarter, since 2024.

In order to ensure the comparability of the data with the data from 2023, a Post-Census Audit was conducted for the data from 2021, which were published in the dissemination database.

The analysis and comparison of data with 2022 in this Bulletin was performed on the revised data (more details in the section: Methodology explanations).

Therefore, the data from this Bulletin are not comparable with the data published in the previous bulletins of the same name, or the announcements published during 2023.

Basic indicators

According to the Labour Force Survey, the number of the people aged 15+ in 2023 has dropped by 0.6% compared to 2022, and it amounted to 5 665 900. The employed population amounted to 2 842 000, and has increased by 0.8% compared to the previous year, while the unemployed populations noted a slight drop by 0.2%, amounting to 295 800 in 2023. Population outside the labour force noted a drop by 2.2% at the interannual period, amounting to 2 528 100 persons in 2023.

The employment rate in 2023 amounted to 50.2%, which makes an increase by 0.7 percentage points (pp) compared to 2022, while the unemployment and population outside the labour force rates have dropped by 0.1 pp and 0.7 pp respectively. Thus the unemployment rate in the observed year amounted to 9.4%, and population outside the labour force rate amounted to 44.6%.

The Belgrade region records the most positive trends in the labour market

The Belgrade region recorded an increase in the employment rate in 2023 by 1.5 pp, a drop of the unemployment rate by 0.6 pp, and a drop of population outside the labour force by 1.4 pp compared to the previous year. Thus, the employment rate in the Belgrade region amounted to 55.5%, unemployment rate amounted 7.1%, and the population outside the labour force rate amounted to 40.2%.

In addition to the Belgrade region, the increase in the employment rate was recorded in Vojvodina Region (by 1.2 pp, with a rate of 50.3%) and the Šumadija and Western Serbia Region (0.2 pp, with a rate of 49.4%), while the Region of Southern and Eastern Serbia recorded a drop in the employment rate by 0.2 pp, amounting to 44.7%.

Similar to the Belgrade region, the unemployment rate also has a descending trend in the Region of Šumadija and Western Serbia as much as 1.2 pp, amounting to 9.8% in 2023. In contrast to these two regions, the unemployment rate is increasing in the Region of Vojvodina and the Region of Southern and Eastern Serbia by 1.0 p. p. and 0.9 p. p. respectively, so the rates of 9.0% and 12.8% were recorded in those regions, respectively.

In addition to the Belgrade region, the rate the population outside the labour force also recorded a decrease in the Vojvodina Region, by a slightly higher percentage point (1.8), with a value of 44.8%. This rate in the Region of Southern and Eastern Serbia was 48.7%, which also makes a slight drop (0.4 p.p.), while there was an increase in the Region of Šumadija and Western Serbia by 0.6 p.p., so the rate of population outside the labour force was 45.3%.

Position of young people at the labour market

The contingent of young people aged from 15 to 24 continued to decrease in 2023, and it is lesser by 3 800 (1.9%) compared to 2022. The youth population in 2023 amounted to 672 500.

The decrease of the contingent of employed young people amounted to 3 100, so the number of the employed in the observed year was 160 700. The employment rate in this age cohort amounted to 23.9%, which is a drop by 0.3 pp compared to 2022. Observed by regions, the employment rate in this age category was the highest in Vojvodina Region, like in 2022, and it amounted to 26.8%. The lowest employment rate was yet again recorded in the Region of Southern and Eastern Serbia, amounting to 20.6%.

The number of unemployed aged 15-24 has slightly increased (by 1000 persons) compared to the previous year, amounting to 53 600. The unemployment rate has thus recorded an increase by 0.7 pp, amounting to 25.0% in 2023.

Population of young people outside the labour force has also recorded and insignificant annual growth (0.1 pp), amounting to 68.1%, while population outside the labour force amounted to 458 200. The highest value of this rate was recorded in the Region of Šumadija and Western Serbia, with a value of 70.1%. Same as 2022, the lowest rate of population outside the labour force was recorded in Vojvodina Region with 65.2%.

The NEET rate, representing the share of people aged 15–24 who are not in employed, education or training in the total population of the said age, amounted to 12.4% in 2023, and it has reduced by 0.9 pp compared to 2022.

The "Early school leaving" indicator, which represents a percentage of young people aged 18 to 24 who have completed at most the primary school and did not continue further schooling (did not attend school or training in the past four weeks), amounted to 5.8% in 2023, and it is higher by 0.1 pp compared to 2022.

Position of women at the labour market

Trends at the labour market this year show a positive shift in the female population, which is primarily reflected in the increase in the number of employed women by 29 300 and an increase of employment rate by 1.3 pp, while the employment rate of men has increased by 0.1 pp. Such trends have resulted in the reduction in the difference in the employment rate of women compared to the employment rate of the male population to 13.2 p. p. In 2023, the number of employed women was 1 286 100, while the number of employed men was 1 555 900. The employment rate in the female population was 43.8%, while the male employment rate in 2023 was 57.0%.


Compared to 2022, the unemployment rate records a drop by 0.1 pp with both sexes. These rates amounted to 9.9% in female and 9.0% in male population in 2023, while the number of unemployed women was 141 500, and 154 400 men.

The outside the labour force population contingent in 2023 recorded a drop primarily in female population, by 48 400, while there were 7 900 less men outside the labour force than in 2022. Thus, the rate of population outside the labour force recorded a decrease in both sexes, amounting to 51.4% for women and 37.3% for men and in 2023, which represents a decrease of 1.3 pp and 0.1 pp respectively.

Informal employment

In 2023, there was an increase of formally employed persons by 34 200, and a decrease of informally employed individuals by 10 800. Such trends have resulted in a drop in informal employment rate by 0.5 pp compared to 2022, amounting to 12.5% in the observed year.

The number of informally employed individuals recorded a decrease in the agriculture sector by 5 400, in the services sector by 3 300, in the industry sector by 1 900, while the construction sector recorded almost the same number of informally employed persons as in 2022.

Rounding rules

The Labour Force Results are published rounded to thousands, with one decimal place.

Total values (summaries) are not always in agreement with the sums of individual information considering that the results provided in statistical publications are calculated with use of unrounded numbers (providing more accurate data).








Methodological explanations

METHODOLOGY EXPLANATIONS

The Labour Force Survey (LFS) is a survey used to collect information about the main characteristics of labour force in order to evaluate the total scope of labour force in the country. The overall objective of the survey is to obtain information about three basic, mutually exclusive population contingents: employed, unemployed and population outside the labour force — on their demographic, social-economic, educational and other characteristics.

Information obtained from LFS is used for monitoring, measuring and evaluating economic and social trends both in the Republic of Serbia and for international comparison. In terms of methodology, organization, sampling, questionnaire design and definitions of employed/unemployed the LFS is implemented in compliance with standards and recommendations of the International Labour Organization (ILO) and regulations of the European Statistical Office (Eurostat), enabling the comparison of data obtained from the LFS with equivalent data from other (especially European) countries.

The survey results are published in an aggregated form, completely ensuring the confidentiality of individual information on households and individuals pursuant to the Official Statistics Law (Official Gazette of the Republic of Serbia, No. 104/09).

Since January 2021, the Labour Force Survey has been implemented based on and in compliance with the new Regulation of the European Parliament and the Council.

Revisions

After the first major revision, which was conducted due to the application of new methodology concepts from 2021, the second major **Post-census** revision was conducted in 2023.

From the first quarter of 2023, results (LFS data) are calculated based on demographic estimates for 2022, which are based on the 2022 Census. Demographic estimates based on the 2011 Census were used to calculate the results conclusive with the fourth quarter of 2022.

In addition, the results for the reference quarter in the observed year until 2023 were calculated based on demographic estimates for the year proceeding the observed year. Due to the improvement of the quality of demographic estimates in terms of improving the timeliness of data, requirements for the calculation of results of the reference quarter based of demographic estimates for the reference quarter have been met since 2024.

Population estimates are based on the results of the population census and the results of statistical processing of natural (births and deaths) and mechanical (internal migration) population movements.

From 2024, an automated electronic download of administrative data (births, deaths and internal migrations) necessary for monitoring basic demographic changes was developed as of 2024, which significantly shortens the data processing period; thus making the demographic estimates available one month after the reference period.

Therefore, the annual data for 2023 in the Bulletin has been calculated (revised) in accordance with the latest evaluation based on current demographic estimates based on the 2022 Census. Aiming to ensure comparability of data without interruption of the time series caused by the application of weights based on the latest demographic indicators, a post-census revision of the LFS data was carried out for the period of 2021 and 2022.

Interview unit

The interview unit is each member of a randomly selected household. The basic socio-demographic data are collected for all individuals in the selected households, while data on labour activity are collected for persons aged 15+ only.

Observation period

The Labour Force Survey has been implemented as a continuous survey since 2015. Each week in a year is an observed (reference) week. The interview period lasts for two weeks after the observed week. A reference week is specified for each household in the sample. As one household appears four times in the sample, the interval between two successive appearances in the sample, i.e. interviews, cannot be shorter than three months.

The observation period for the first quarter included 13 reference weeks, and it lasted from 2 January to 2 April 2023, while the interview period lasted from 9 January to 16 April 2023.

The observation period for the second quarter included 13 reference weeks and it lasted from 3 April to 2 July 2023, while the interview period lasted from 10 April to 16 July 2023.

The observation period for the third quarter included 13 reference weeks and it lasted from 3 July to 1 October 2023, while the interview period lasted from 10 July to 15 October 2023.

The observation period for the fourth quarter included 13 reference weeks and it lasted from 2 October to 31 December 2023, while the interview period lasted from 9 October 2023 to 14 January 2024.

A **week** in the Labour Force Survey is defined as a seven-day period, starting on Monday and ending on Sunday inclusive.

Definitions

Starting from 2021, the Labour Force Survey has been implemented on the basis of Regulation (EU) 2019/1700 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 10 October 2019, establishing a common framework for European statistics on persons and households, based on data at individual level collected from samples, amending Regulations (EC) 808/2004, (EC) 452/2008 and (EC) 1338/2008 of the European Parliament and of the Council, and repealing Regulation (EC) 1177/2003 of the European Parliament and of the Council and Regulation (EC) 577/98, and in particular Article 7 paragraph 1, Article 8, paragraph 3 and Article 13, paragraph 6 thereof. The new Regulation (EU) 2019/1700, on which basis the Survey is conducted, is based on the application of provisions of the "Resolution on labour statistics, employment and underutilized labour", which was adopted in 2013 at the 19th International Conference of Labour Statisticians in Geneva, and recommended for use by the International Labour Organization (ILO).

A household is

a) any family or other community of persons who declare that: 1) they live together in the entire residential unit or in any part thereof; 2) they provide food for themselves and meet other basic needs for living; 3) they share revenue or household expenses with other household members. Sharing household revenue means contributing to or benefiting from the household revenue.

b) any persons living alone (single-member household), not having their own household in another place, living in a separate, or shared apartment as a single person or as a tenant, regardless of whether they live in the same room with another single person or the landlord's household member, not spending their revenue with them but only paying for housing services.

Collective households (student dormitories, homes for children and youth with mental and physical disabilities, homes for socially vulnerable children, homes for the elderly and infirm, homes for adults with disabilities, monasteries, etc.) are not included in the survey.

Employed population includes persons aged 15–89 who belonged to one of the following categories during the observation week:

• Persons who worked at least one hour for earnings or income during the observed week, including unpaid family workers;

- Persons who have a job or business from which they were temporarily absent during the entire observed week, but are related to the job, such as:
- Persons absent from work due to holidays, redistribution of working hours, sick leave, maternity leave, work-related training;
- Persons on parental leave, whether receiving earnings or benefits from work from which they are absent, or whose expected duration of parental leave is up to 3 months;
- Seasonal workers out of season, if they continue to regularly perform tasks and duties for the job or business from which they are absent, excluding the fulfilment of legal or administrative obligations;
- Persons who did not work in the observed week for some other reasons, and whose expected duration
 of absence is up to 3 months;
- Persons producing agricultural products, the main part of which is intended for sale or exchange (barter).

Based on the Resolution on Labour Statistics, Employment and Underutilization of Labour adopted in 2013 at the 19th International Conference of Labour Statisticians, persons producing goods for own use, volunteers, persons in unpaid training and persons involved in other forms of work, are not included in the contingent of employed based on these activities.

According to the **Professional Status Classification** of the employed, they are divided into self-employed, employees and unpaid family workers.

Self-employed are persons who work independently in their own company, institution, private shop or on an agricultural holding, as well as persons performing independent professional activity or another job for their own account.

Employees are persons working for an employer in any kind of ownership sector, regardless of whether they have a formal employment contract or work based on an oral agreement. Household members helping with family business, who are paid for their work, are considered employees.

Unpaid family workers are relatives who help with the family business or at the family holding without earnings or income. These include e.g. a son or daughter working at their parents' company / at a holding without compensation; a wife helping her husband without compensation, etc. This also includes relatives who live elsewhere but come to help with the business, e.g. during the harvest season, without payment in cash or in kind.

Unemployed population includes individuals aged 15-74:

- Not employed in the observed week, in accordance with the aforementioned definition of employment;
- Currently available for work, or available to start working as paid employees or self-employed within two
 weeks after the observation week;
- Actively searching for a job, whether they took activities in the previous four weeks conclusive with the observed week in order to look for paid employment or self-employment, or have found a job to start working no later than three months after the observation week.

Seasonal workers not working during the observed week (because they are out of season), expecting however to return to their seasonal work, are considered to have found a job.

Active population (labour force) consists of all the employed and unemployed persons.

Population outside the labour force includes:

- Persons younger than 15;
- Persons older than 89;
- Persons aged between 15 and 89 not employed or unemployed during the observed week according to the aforementioned definitions of employment and unemployment.

Potentially active population (potential labour force) includes population outside the labour force that is somehow related to the labour market. It consists of individuals who are actively searching for employment but cannot start working immediately (i.e. within two weeks), and person who desire and can start working immediately although they have not searched for a job.

Subjective employment status is the respondent's employment status according to their own opinion and not according to their actual activity in the observed week.

Employment rate is the share of the employed in the total observed population (population aged 15+).

Informal employment is considered to be work in unregistered business entities, work in registered business entities without an employment contract, and work of unpaid family workers.

Informal employment rate is the share of informally employed in total employment.

Unemployment rate is the share of the unemployed in the labour force (employed and unemployed).

Long-term unemployment rate is the share of individuals in the labour force (employed and unemployed) who have been unemployed for more than one year.

NEET rate is the share of persons aged 15-24 (or 15-29) who are who are not in employed, education or training in the total population of the said age.

Activity rate (labour force participation) is the share of active population in the total observed population (population aged 15+).

Population outside the labour force rate is the share of population outside the labour force in the total observed population (population aged 15+)

Classifications

The following classifications were used in coding and processing the data obtained by the survey:

- 1. Classification of Activities of the European Union (NACE rev. 2), comparable to the Classification of Activities of the United Nations (ISIC rev. 4);
- 2. International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO 08);
- 3. International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED 2011);
- 4. Classification of Fields of Education (ISCED-F 2013) supplementing the International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED 2011);
- 5. International Classification of Status in Employment (ICSE-93).

Sample design

The **basic set** includes households and persons referring to common population in the territory of the Republic of Serbia without the Region of Kosovo and Metohia. Persons in collective households (student dormitories, homes for children and youth with mental and physical disabilities, homes for socially vulnerable children, homes for the elderly and infirm, homes for adults with disabilities, monasteries, etc.) are excluded.

Type of sample – Two-stage stratified sample. The first stage units are enumeration areas and the second stage units are households.

Stratification – Enumeration areas as primary sampling units are stratified by the type of settlement (city and other) and by territory at the NUTS 3 level (25 districts: Belgrade, West Bačka, South Banat, Sounth Bačka, North Banat, North Bačka, Central Banat, Srem, Zlatibor, Kolubara, Mačva, Moravica, Pomoravlje, Rasina, Raška, Šumadija, Bor, Braničevo, Zaječar, Jablanica, Nišava, Pirot, Podunavlje, Pčinja and Toplica).

Sampling frame – The population census implemented in the Republic of Serbia in 2011 was used as a frame for the selection of the enumeration areas and households. It was formed by excluding all the enumeration areas with 19 or less households. The frame was therewith reduced by about 1.5% in regard to the basic set. The enumeration areas that included the selected households surveyed for the first time were updated based on the 2022 Census.

Sample size – The planned annual sample size amounts to 76 960 households in 7 696 enumeration areas.

Sample allocation – Proportional allocation according on the number of persons aged 15+ within the type of settlement and territory was slightly corrected in order to obtain better precision of evaluation at the level of districts and uniform distribution of the sample in time. Each subsample allocated for a quarter is uniformly and randomly distributed to 13 weeks for all four quarters. 52 weeks were observed in 2023.

Sample selection – The sample for 2023 includes nine independent subsamples selected according to the same sample pattern. The first stage units (enumeration areas) are selected systematically with probability proportional to the number of individuals aged 15+. Enumeration areas within each stratum were sorted according to the municipality they belong to and the serial number within the municipality. High level of implicit geographic stratification and effective sample distribution were secured that way with the systematic selection. The second stage units (households) were selected with equal probabilities (simply randomly).

Rotation scheme – The Labour Force Survey is based on the sample rotation panel design, which includes each household four times in a sample. The 2-2-2 rotation pattern was applied. Four subsamples (rotation groups) were allocated for each quarter. Each quarter (Q) in the sample included: one new rotation group, two rotation groups from the previous quarter (Q-1) and one rotation group from Q-3 quarter. Based on the applied rotation pattern, each household and each individual selected in the sample was interviewed 4 times within 18 months, i.e. each household and individual was surveyed in two consecutive quarters, left out from the sample for the next two quarters, and surveyed again in the next two consecutive quarters.

Sample realization – The total of 113 113 persons were interviewed, and data on working activity were collected for 100 544 persons, which makes 1.8% of the total number of population aged 15+.

Evaluation system – To make the sample results representative for the observed general population, each household and individual in the sample were appended a weight (expansion factor). The main weight component is the reciprocal value of the selection probability product at each stage for each stratum, representing the base weight (sample design weight). The weight second component takes into account the household non-response level. Response rates were calculated after the completion of fieldwork. These were used to correct the sample design weights for each enumeration area. The final weight for an individual and a household was calculated on the basis of the corrected weight for the household with use of the calibration method.

Calibration is a procedure used to multiply the sampling weights by factors (calibration factors) so that the obtained results agree with known totals. Calibration is a practical approach of incorporating auxiliary information in the evaluation phase, which serves to correct any deviations of certain sample contingents that

cannot be avoided during field work. Data obtained on the basis of current demographic estimations are used as auxiliary information for each quarter.

Requirements that must be met in calculation of the calibration factors are as follows: population distribution according to sex (two groups), according to five-year age groups (14 groups), at the level of territory (NUTS 3 level), and household distribution according to the number of household members (six groups), at the level of district, provided that a household and each individual in the observed household have the same final weight, which assures consistent results on household basis and on individual basis.

Total, proportion and their error results are calculated for various indicators. It is not possible to publish each result with its sampling error during the publication of data. The approximate values are calculated based on the regression model to make the data sampling error available to users during the data analysis.
